CITY OF GENEVA PADDLECRAFT SPACE RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1. *Securing and security of the boat is the responsibility of the boat owner. The City of Geneva or employees of the City of Geneva are NOT responsible for boat security against loss, theft or damage should any occur.***
2. Applicants are required to submit an accurate description of their paddlecraft. The racks are periodically checked to make sure permit numbers, rack numbers, and kayak/canoe descriptions are accurate. If owner decides to replace the paddlecraft in their permitted space, the City of Geneva must be notified and an updated application must be submitted to staff.
3. Only one paddlecraft per rack space.
4. Applications must be submitted annually and rack spaces are permitted on a first-come-first-serve basis.
5. Owner is responsible for providing their own lock/cable/chain for each space.
6. Owner agrees to not use, touch, tamper with or remove any other paddlecraft from any other rack space other than the one they were assigned.
7. Owner agrees to keep their rack space and area surrounding the racks clean and clear of debris, supplies, etc.
8. If any damage to the rack is done, owner agrees to report the incident immediately to the City of Geneva.
9. All equipment must be removed from assigned rack space 10 days following the end of the permit period. If your paddlecraft is still present after 10 days it will become property of the City of Geneva and will be disposed of as surplus property.
10. The Finger Lakes Welcome Center does not have any affiliation with the City of Geneva's paddlecraft storage and shall not be contacted in correlation with owner's rental. The Finger Lakes Welcome Center or employees of the Finger Lakes Welcome Center are NOT responsible for boat security against loss, theft or damage should any occur.
11. The City of Geneva reserves the right to reject any or all applications if it is deemed to be in the best interest of the City.
12. The City of Geneva and City of Geneva staff reserve the right to enforce and/or change the rules in accordance to our residents, visitors, and community safety at any time. If you do not comply, your permit may be revoked and your paddlecraft must be removed within 10 days of notice of revocation.
13. Applicants agree to indemnify and hold harmless the City of Geneva, city elected and appointed officials, administrators, and all other city employees, volunteers or representatives, and all persons and bodies corporate acting for or on behalf of them against all liability, claims, demands, actions, suits, damages, proceedings, costs and expenses whatsoever for which they may be or become liable directly or indirectly arising out of the use of city premises by the User(s).
14. All users of the paddlecraft rack and boat ramp understand and agree that water sports are inherently dangerous and at their own risk, the City of Geneva does not provide lifeguards on duty and it is the sole responsibility of individuals to evaluate risk and conditions including wearing and carrying required and appropriate safety gear and complying with safe boating practices and requirements. Weather conditions change quickly on the lake and anyone in or near the water is likely to encounter slippery surfaces and unmarked submerged hazards (including at the rack, between the rack and the water, on or around the boat ramp, and in and around the Seneca Lake shore and all City maintained boating facilities, docks, piers, etc).
